The Path to Justice: Celebrating 100 Years of our Court's History

GUIDELINES FOR POSTER CONTEST

To encourage students to express their knowledge of our court system and community issues through art; and to recognize publicly some of the best student artists in each participating elementary school

ELIGIBILITY:

Full-time students in each elementary school's art class, kindergarten through 5th grade.

CONTEST GUIDELINES:

1. The poster art must be the student's own work. Assistance maybe provided in the form of suggestions from peers or adults, but the artist must attest to the fact that the art was solely his or her work.
2. The art must be on a poster board no larger than 22" x 28". The art can be in any form and is not limited to paint or markers. The author's name must not be on the poster.
3. The art should be consistent with the theme, **"What Justice Means to Me"**
4. The artist's name, grade and school must be on a separate sheet of paper. (see attached form.) This paper should be clipped (not stapled) to the poster. (It will be coded and removed before poster is judged).

DEADLINE:

Posters must be received **no later than noon on December 3, 2010.**

WINNERS AND AWARDS:

Three winners (first, second and third place) in each grade (Kindergarten through 5th grade) will be selected by a panel of judges and will be announced at an awards presentation on February 3, 2011 at ____pm at _____.

Awards will be as follows:

Certificates of Participation for each entry;

Commemorative T-shirt for each participant;

\$100.00 savings bond to the third place winner;

\$250.00 savings bond to the second place winner; and

\$500.00 savings bond to the first place winner.

Additionally, each entry will be displayed at particular courthouses during the Centennial Celebration through May, 2011.
